WHEN IS IT AN EMERGENCY?

Seek immediate veterinary care if ANY of the following occur:

- A seizure lasts longer than 5 minutes
- Cluster seizures (2 or more seizures within 24 hours)
- Your pet does not return to normal after a seizure
- Difficulty breathing
- Your pet is injured during the seizure

EMERGENCY SEIZURE PLAN

If a seizure occurs:

- Stay calm and keep my pet safe
- Time the seizure
- Do not put anything in my pet's mouth
- Record what happened
- Administer emergency medication if instructed
- Contact my veterinarian / emergency clinic if needed
